


Collaborated with Community Kitchen







Stormwater Capital Plan

 - Road Resurfacing and V-Gutter Included






Capital Projects: On-Time, On-Budget

Approved Video Gaming Ordinance



- Video Gaming Ordinance Approved October 24, 2023
- Allows Video Gaming in Limited Highly Regulated Manner
- Ordinance Goes Into Effect January 1, 2025
- An Advisory Referendum Question on Video Gaming Has Been Placed on November 2024 Ballot
- Provides Increased Awareness and Opportunity For Public Input
- If Referendum Fails Village Council May Reconsider Video Gaming in November or December 2024


